Philips DreamStation 4G cellular modem connectivity plan terms of use

Part numbers covered by DreamStation 4G cellular connectivity include:

- DreamStation 4G Cell Modem w/Ox 100642C
- DreamStation CPAP Pro AUX400T15C
- DreamStation Auto CPAP AUX500T15C
- DreamStation Auto BiPAP AUX700T15C
- DreamStation BiPAP autoSV AUX900T15C
- DreamStation BiPAP AVAPS AUX1131T15C

In Australia and New Zealand, the part numbers listed above include a 4G cellular modem designed to provide additional support for remote data transfer to sleep therapy providers.

Philips DreamStation 4G cellular modem comes with a five-year connectivity plan that begins on the date of first use. "First use" refers to when you first power on the embedded modem and connect it to the cellular network. DreamStation's 4G cellular modem is designed to record the first time it connects to the cellular network and track connectivity for the subsequent 5 years.

The 4G cellular modem is an optional accessory. After the five-year connectivity period ends, the modem will no longer transmit data via the cellular network. The DreamStation device will continue to operate and store therapy data without the modem.

You can continue sharing therapy data with sleep therapy providers using:

- Bluetooth connectivity together with the DreamMapper app; and
- The SD card included with the DreamStation device

In addition, DreamStation device will store the last 6 months of therapy data.
